1853-1875 Isaac Van Arsdol

1875-1883 William M. Alexander

(Bought large block of land and subdivided it, and sold portion that would become the birthplace home to John C. Graham)

1883-1889 John C Graham

(Well-known and respected deputy sheriff, built the home in 1885)

1889-1893 Archibald Brownlee

(A prominent farmer. The property was an investment. He never lived in the home)

1893-1896 Descendants of Brownlee

(Daughter Ella Winter owned it in 1895)

1896-1898 Robert A. Miller

(Glenn's Grandfather and his wife Sarah, they lived in the house from December 11, 1896 until May 18, 1898, making them the first generation of Millers to own the house. Glenn's father Elmer was a grown man by this time, and he did not live in the home with his parents. However he would have known the house through visits and family functions. In fact, one special family function occurred at the house in 1898 when Elmer and his new bride Mattie Lou (Cavendar) held their wedding reception at the home shortly before it was sold to Robert.)

1898-1901 Samuel M. Greene

(Assistant editor of the Clarinda Herald, he purchased the home for his new bride)

1901-1902 C.H. Howard

(During this time the home was rented to veterinary surgeon, Dr. W.G. Jones. His wife was Susan, was the sister of G.W. Richardson, Owner of Richardson Lumber Company, where Elmer Miller worked)

1902-1906 Elmer Miller

(Purchased the home on August 29, 1902, for \$1,200. The property included a quarter acre of land with a two-story home, a small barn, a granary, and chicken coop, with a large garden on the North side of the house)

1906-1907 M. A. "Mack" Cline

1907-1919 Bruce Watson

(The two-story addition was added about 1912)
